Nicknamed La Tricolor or La Tri, the team proudly represents the yellow, blue, and red of Ecuador's flag colors that show up everywhere on match day.



Ecuador has advanced beyond the group stage once before, but this squad looks ready to push further. Built on defensive discipline and resilience (several of their qualifying matches ended 0-0), La Tri has proven they can grind out results against anyone.

Player to Watch

Moisés Caicedo:

At just 24 years old, Caicedo has established himself as one of the Premier League's top midfielders with Chelsea F.C. Calm under pressure, strong in the tackle, and capable of driving play forward, he's the engine that keeps La Tri balanced. If Ecuador is going to make a deep run in 2026, expect Caicedo to be at the center of it.

How Ecuador Phans Get Hype

La Tri supporters bring color AND volume. Yellow jerseys dominate the stands, flags wave nonstop, and the energy builds with coordinated chants that echo through the stadium. During the 2022 World Cup, Ecuador fans made global headlines with their chant:



“Queremos cerveza!”
(“We want beer!”)

The chant started during the opening match against Qatar in response to the stadium alcohol ban and quickly became one of the tournament’s most talked-about fan moments. When La Tri plays, expect loud, unified chanting, flag-waving in yellow, blue, and red, and a crowd that stays engaged from kickoff to final whistle.

Altitude is part of Ecuador’s DNA. The national team plays many home matches in Quito, nearly 2,800 meters (about 9,200 feet) above sea level. Visiting teams often struggle with the thin air, but for La Tri, it’s home-field advantage.
