Ghana's best World Cup finish came in 2010, when they powered all the way to the quarter finals, one kick away from the semi-finals and a place in tournament history.

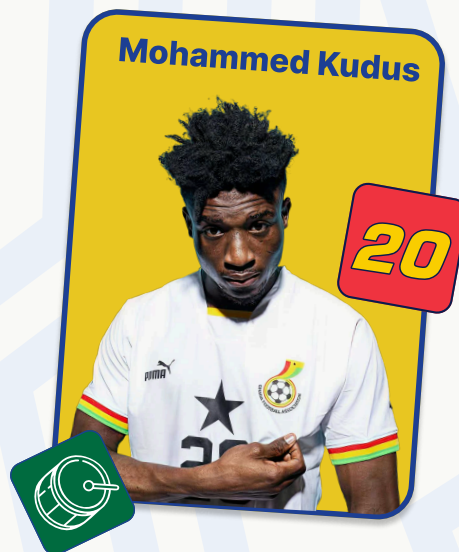
Now, the Black Stars are chasing that magic again.
